SCHEDULE OF COLLATERAL - MISDEMEANORS

This schedule is published pursuant to the Local Rule 58 for misdemeanor violations and is intended to allow accused persons to be freed from custody when, because of the hour of the circumstances, it is not practicable to bring the accused person before a judicial officer. Nothing in this schedule is intended to limit an enforcement officer's discretion to require a personal appearance of an accused in Court or to seek criminal charges in an appropriate case (See Local Rule 58).

SCHEDULE 1

Motor vehicle and traffic offenses within the boundaries of Rock Island Arsenal, and, except as provided for in other applicable schedules, other United States Government parks, forests, building sites and reservations, such offenses being made public offenses by Illinois Vehicle Code, 625 Illinois Compiled Statutes and made applicable by Title 18, United States Code, Section 13:

- (1) All motor vehicle traffic offenses, except those requiring a Court appearance under (2) below, may be satisfied without a Court appearance by following the procedure set forth in Local Rule 58 upon payment of \$75.00, except that a charge of speeding more than 20 mph, but not more than 30 mph over the speed limit, may be satisfied upon payment of \$95.00. Parking where prohibited violations may be satisfied upon payment of \$15.00, except that unauthorized parking in a parking place reserved for handicapped persons may be satisfied upon payment of \$250.00. Violation of the provisions requiring drivers and passengers to use safety belts shall require a \$55.00 fine.
- (2) A Court appearance is required for:
 - (a) All alleged Class A and Class B misdemeanor violations of the Illinois Vehicle Code (625 ILCS 5/1-100, et seq.).
 - (b) All alleged violations of the following specified sections:

Unless otherwise specifically ordered by a United States Court, any wildlife or property which has been seized under the authority of the Migratory Bird Treaty Act, 16 U.S.C. §§ 703-711; the National Wildlife Refuge Systems Administrative Act, 16 U.S.C. §§ 721-731; The Eagle Protection Act, 16 U.S.C. §§ 668-668e; The Endangered Species Act, 16 U.S.C. §§ 1531-1542; The Migratory Waterfowl Hunting Stamp Act, 16 U.S.C. §§ 718-718i; The Airborne Hunting Act, 16 U.S.C. § 742j-1; The Marine Mammal Protection Act, 16 U.S.C. §§ 1361-1407; The Tariff Classification Act, 19 U.S.C. § 1202; The Lacey Act, 18 U.S.C. § 42; The Lacey Act Amendments, 16 U.S.C. §§ 3371-3378; The American Antiquities Act, 16 U.S.C. § 433; The African Elephant Conservation Act, 16 U.S.C. §§ 4201-4245; The Archeological Resources Protection Act, 16 U.S.C. § 470aa et seq.; and The Wild Bird Conservation Act, 16 U.S.C. §§ 4901-4916, where in the final disposition of the case has been made by either payment of a forfeiture of collateral or a judgment by the Court on behalf of the government and where so authorized by statute, such wildlife or property shall be forfeited to the United States Government and disposed of by the United States Fish and Wildlife Service in the manner prescribed by Title 50, Code of Federal Regulations, Part 12.

MANDATORY COURT APPEARANCES OR ARRESTS

Recognizing the concern of the United States Fish and Wildlife Service regarding recidivists and aggravated offenses, it is herein provided that if, within the discretion of the law enforcement officer, the offense is of an aggravated nature, the law enforcement officer, notwithstanding the preceding Forfeiture of Collateral Schedule, may require mandatory appearance before the presiding United States Magistrate Judge. Nothing herein shall prohibit the law enforcement officer from arresting a person for the commission of any offense including those for which collateral may be posted and forfeited and taking said person immediately before a United States Magistrate Judge.

FISH, WILDLIFE & PLANT VALUATION TABLE

Replacement values may be added to the collateral amounts per officer discretion. Values shall be assessed on a per capita basis (*i.e.*, separate value added for each fish, wildlife and plant species possessed, transported, killed, etc., in violation of the law).

In cases where the replacement values noted in the table are lower than the declared value of the item, the higher of the two values shall be used.
