- Grade level (Grade ranges will be: K-5, 6-8, and 9-12)
- County and state of residence
- School (or note if homeschooled)
- Teacher who referred you (if applicable)

Limit essays to no more than 500 words. *Limit videos to 3 - 5 minutes or less.* *Include your parent or guardian on the email*
