June 20, 2017, 16:56:13

BC: Brendt Christensen

TB: Terra Bullis

TB: Tuesday, June 20th. It's about 4:56. Brendt just got here.

BC: I mean, this whole situation is not over yet, but they're not following me anymore. So...

TB: Yeah, that's encouraging.

BC: I mean, the thing is I think they have access to everything they're going to have access to, and they're not going to try and get anything else especially from you.

TB: That's good.

BC: So, just umm...I'm going to recommend that you don't...if they come and question you just use your right to remain silent, please. Just, umm...

TB: ...annoying.

TB: Huh?

BC: Stressful and annoying?

TB: Yeah.

TB: So, and I'm not going to like cry or anything, umm, you think if they like for some reason ask me something or they want to talk or something just say like I don't want to talk or?

BC: Umm...

TB: Like I'm stressed out or...

BC: I don't know. Use your best judgment. I just don't know what they could ask that would be in my benefit. That's what I mean.

TB: Like would I get in trouble?

BC: No.

TB: Like what if they suspect me of something?

BC: They won't. Just do whatever, do what's ever in your best interest. Ok? So...

TB: I don't have a whole lot [Unintelligible] I guess I just don't have a whole lot of judgment in that respect.

BC: Yeah.

TB: Like...

BC: Just forget I said anything, ok?

TB: I'm sorry. I don't...

BC: No, seriously, forget I said anything. Don't worry about it, ok?

TB: I don't mean to worry you. I'm just trying to be good.

BC: No, no. You're not. You're not.

TB: I want to be a good bunny.

BC: That's why, that's why just forget I said anything, ok? I don't want to put you in a weird pl...position. Do what you think is best for yourself, ok? That could mean...just, yeah, forget I said anything, alright?

TB: I'm sorry.

BC: Don't worry about it, ok?

BC: Yeah, I wouldn't worry about it. It's harmless.

TB: I know it's harmless, but then it makes me...it makes me question like my whole ethical infrastructure.

BC: Yeah.

TB: You know? Like, okay, so if that little bit's okay like where's the line? Like what would be? And your whole testing the limits thing, and now I'm just like, "Fuck."

BC: I mean...

TB: Because maybe we're more alike than you think.

BC: I think we're really alike, but right now, I'm kind of, I just want to sit in my apartment and do nothing.

TB: Yeah.

BC: [Unintelligible].

TB: [Unintelligible] pushing boundaries?

BC: Yeah, pretty much.

TB: And I, I figured that. And I didn't want to be like...I feel like a role reversal kind of, in that I'm kind of like what...it's really confusing to me.

BC: Yeah.

TB: And this whole thing has made me...curious about things. And I, and again, it's so irreverent and I totally know that it's like [audible sigh] I don't understand. This is not the effect that any of this is supposed to have on me... at all. Like am I just that kinky that I'm...

TB: We can go straight.

TB: I don't understand how they can like...I just don't understand. It really bothers me.

BC: Me too. Well, umm, I'll feel better when we get our shit back. Hopefully that'll be this week.

TB: I would say once you get your stuff back that's the end of their dealings with you.

BC: No. That's not true.

TB: No? Seriously?

BC: Yeah.

TB: I must not know much about the system because...

BC: It means that they've gotten everything they can get off of it, but that doesn't mean it's done. Umm, yeah.

TB: I want this to be over.

BC: I know.

TB: It's so stupid. Because honestly, I'm concerned, and this is so selfish of me, but I'm concerned that like until it's over, I'm going to be like grounded. Like...
